Carillion Building has again joined forces with youth charity The Prince's Trust to give 12 young people in Nottingham the opportunity to try their hand at working in the construction industry. Between 21 February and 4 March 2011,

Carillion Building and Carillion Training Services, hosted a 'Get into Construction' course at Forest Recreation Ground in Forest Fields which is currently undergoing renovation works to the Pavilion, Lodge and park areas as part of a £3.5 million Heritage Lottery Funded project.

The Prince's Trust Get into Construction course offers tuition in bricklaying, joinery, paving and horticulture operations and the young people also got to find about the construction industry through site tours and presentations.

Carillion Building continued to support the people who completed the course by providing two-week work experience placements, further details of this can be found within the case study "Work Experience September".

Additionally we are working hard to identify routes into permanent employment which may involve further partnerships with the NCC project 'Get Nottingham Working' and Job Centre Plus.

Including this course, we have to date hosted nine courses which have benefited 113 young people, giving them the skills and confidence they need to help find work.
