

Nottingham's LEP put a smile on their mug

On Friday, 24 September 2010, Nottingham's award winning Local Education Partnership (LEP) will be inviting colleagues to 'put a smile on their mug' and help Macmillan Cancer Support!

Nottingham's LEP is supporting this year's World's Biggest Coffee Morning by inviting partners to drop into the office for a cuppa and help change the lives of people affected by cancer.

Nottingham's LEP is a public private partnership between Nottingham City Council and *inspiredspaces*. *inspiredspaces* is a consortium which brings together Carillion, a leading support services company and Capita ICT Services.

The coffee morning coincides with the end of Carillion's 'Values Week 2010' which runs from 20 to 24 September. Carillion's six values create a culture which makes it easy for their customers, like Nottingham City Council, to work with them.
