## Welcome to our first Community Newsletter

The communities within which we work are extremely important to us – this newsletter is intended to keep local residents and

stakeholders informed as to progress on the site and provide essential Information on the construction works.

Harvey Hadden Sports Complex is currently being redeveloped and is on schedule to open in spring 2015. The development is the largest investment of Nottingham City Council's Leisure Centre Transformation Programme and will contribute to the ongoing regeneration of this area of the city. Additional investment from Sport England's Iconic Facilities Fund will further enhance sporting provision on-site, allowing Harvey Hadden to provide world class sports facilities and inspire future generations.

As you may be aware there was a serious accident at the Harvey Hadden site in February where a man working for one of our suppliers was injured. Our thoughts remain with the family and friends of the injured man and we wish him a full and speedy recovery. Safety is Carillion's number one priority and the incident is being thoroughly investigated.



### CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS – January – February 2014

The reconfiguration of the existing Leisure Centre building has now started, with the entrance canopy and internal changing rooms being demolished. We have completed the concreting to the new pool base in January. We are now concreting sections of the wall at the deep end of the pool.

### PLANNED WORKS – March- April 2014

In the coming month our planned works are:

- continuation of the swimming pool construction, including foundations and drainage
- continuation of drainage and foundation works to all areas
- completion of initial phase of the demolition works.

### DID YOU KNOW...?

- Road sweepers are brought to the site to maintain the cleanliness of the area when needed.
- In January, 73% of those employed on-site were local labour
- So far, £2.8 million has been spent on contractors within an NG postcode on the HHLC project.

### The £16m redevelopment will include state of the art facilities:

- 50 metre swimming pool which can be divided into two 25 metre pools
- 2 multi-use activity studios for fitness movement and dance
- large fitness gym
- health suite with sauna, steam room and Jacuzzi
- 3 new squash courts
- new indoor and outdoor changing rooms
- improved access and facilities for disabled people
- pool viewing and spectator seating
- café and vending facilities
